Bristol Echo is pleased to host an **Early Education: Birth to 3 Roadshow** with keynote speaker **Julia Manning-Morton**.

Decades of evidence has emphasised the importance of the **first 3 years of life**, at the same time, there has been **increasing demand for out-of-home provision** for these age groups. And yet, the **focus on the wellbeing, play, development and learning** of 0-3-year-olds has waxed and waned over the last 30 years both in policy and provision.

Julia will consider **past and present contexts**, and remind us why it is important that we **keep our youngest children at the forefront of our minds and central to our practice and provision**. Key ideas about the care, **play, development and learning** of 0-3-year-olds will be addressed, and Julia will start from the premise that, to effectively support children's wellbeing, the **wellbeing of practitioners** must also be supported.

Following Julia's presentation **Bristol Lead Teachers** will facilitate a discussion about how the **quality of provision** for children from **birth to 3 can be raised**. Questions raised by research along with **CPD opportunities and training gaps** are all up for debate. Whether you are **newly qualified** or an **experienced practitioner** working with this age group, we want you to be part of the discussion.

Julia is an associate of Early Education and her career in the early childhood field has included roles as a practitioner (nursery nurse), manager, adviser and inspector across a range of settings for children aged 0-7 years as well as a senior lecturer in Early Childhood Studies. She is able to deliver training across all aspects of early childhood, tailoring this to a setting's needs. For much of her career, Julia's particular interest and passion has been to support the development of effective practice and provision that meets the needs of children from birth to three years old; she has extensive experience and expertise in running courses in this area.

In 2001 Julia produced the *Key Times Framework* (published by OUP in 2006) and was part of the *Birth to Three Matters Project Group* in 2002. Her most recent book in this area is Manning-Morton, J and Thorp, M. (2015) *Two-year-olds in early years settings: Journeys of Discovery*. Julia's research and writing is also focused on the personal, social and emotional well-being of children and practitioners. She has trained in group dynamics and interpersonal skills and is particularly interested in working with leaders in supporting teams to meet the emotional needs of babies and young children. Julia's training approach is collaborative, inclusive, respectful and serious fun!
